


2017-2018 ANNUAL REPORT



FROM THE STATE OFFICE


The 2017-2018 school year was an exciting one for Communities In Schools ("CIS") throughout Virginia, where we were able to impact 86% (42,826) of all students attending 76 CIS partner schools through our school-wide initiatives. Additionally, of our case-managed students, 87% graduated with post-secondary academic and/or career plans, and 81% improved their attendance, behavior and/or academics. As our Theory of Change illustrates - by developing relationships with our students, and providing high-quality supports that develop their social, emotional and academic competencies, we are able to improve their likelihood of staying in school and being successful in life.



We are extremely proud of our work and the difference that we make in schools and school districts across Virginia, but we are constantly reminded that we cannot do this work without our volunteers, partners, supporters, and friends. 






Our 85 site coordinators are in K-12 schools every day, building relationships with students and working hand-inhand with over 5,100 volunteers, 523 community partners, school administrators and teachers to surround students with a network of supports that create access to the resources and opportunities that help them overcome life's current and future barriers. 


THE IMPACT OF THE STATE OFFICE
